Major Dynasties	1) Mamluk (Slave)- 1206-1290 CE 2) Khalji- 1290-1320 CE 3) Tughlaq- 1320-1414 CE 4) Sayyid- 1414-1451 CE 5) Lodi- 1451-1526 CE
Sources of Information	Amir Khusrau (poet, chronicler), Ziauddin Barani, Ibn Battuta (traveler)
Origin	Mostly Turkic & Afghan rulers
Achievements	Centralized administration, expansion of empire, Indo-Islamic architecture

Important Rulers and Contributions

Dynasty	Ruler	Period	Contribution
Mamluk	Qutb-ud-din Aibak	1206-1210	Founder, laid foundation of Qutb Minar, established Delhi as capital
Mamluk	Iltutmish	1211-1236	Consolidated empire, introduced Iqta system, recognized by Caliph of Baghdad
Mamluk	Raziya Sultan	1236-1240	First and only female ruler of Delhi Sultanate



Khalji	Jalal-ud-din Khalji	1290-1296	Founder of Khalji dynasty
Khalji	Alauddin Khalji	1296-1316	Expanded empire to South India, market reforms, revenue reforms, defended against Mongols
Tughlaq	Ghiyas-ud-din Tughlaq	1320-1325	Founded Tughlaq dynasty, strengthened administration
Tughlaq	Muhammad bin Tughlaq	1325-1351	Known for experiments: token currency, shifting capital (Delhi → Daulatabad)
Tughlaq	Firoz Shah Tughlaq	1351-1388	Irrigation works, forts, mosques, population reforms
Sayyid	Khizr Khan	1414-1421	Founder, weak rulers, dependent on regional chiefs
Lodi	Bahlul Lodi	1451-1489	Founder of Lodi dynasty, Afghan origin
Lodi	Sikandar Lodi	1489-1517	Consolidated empire, founded Agra
Lodi	Ibrahim Lodi	1517-1526	Last Sultan, defeated by Babur (First Battle of Panipat)

Administration and Economy

Aspect	Details
Political System	Centralized monarchy with provincial governors
Administration	Iqta system (land revenue assignment), Wazir (Prime Minister), Diwan (finance), Qazi (judge)
Military	Cavalry-based army, elephants, forts at strategic locations
Revenue System	Land revenue major source, trade taxes, market regulations
Economy	Agriculture, trade (internal & overseas), crafts, handicrafts, coinage
Currency	Tanka (gold/silver), Jital (copper)
Trade Centers	Delhi, Multan, Gujarat, Bengal, Malwa

Category	Features
Religion	Islam dominant among rulers, Hindu majority populace, Sufi influence
Society	Hierarchical, caste distinctions persisted among Hindus, introduction of Sharia law in administration
Culture	Indo-Islamic architecture, mosques, tombs, forts, Qutb Minar, Alai Darwaza, Tughlaqabad Fort
Literature	Amir Khusrau - poet, historian; Barani - chronicler of Delhi Sultanate
Education	Madrasas established, Persian language and literature flourished
Arts	Miniature paintings, calligraphy, ornamental architecture
